As you will see through the following pages, this term was a busy one with many extra-curricular events. That said, teaching and learning is our main priority. Students who miss classroom learning due to extra-curricular events have been able to access classroom learning with the Google Classroom platform. This platform does require our teachers to ensure content and assignments are up to date, yet the extra effort is worth it so no student misses a learning opportunity while they are away.

Our year 10 students are deciding on their subject choices for years 11 and 12. We have had a number of meetings with parents and students to discuss future pathways. These meetings will continue into the first two weeks of Term 3. These interviews are beneficial, as there are many considerations as to pathways for senior school, as well as understanding the best combination of subjects to suit interests and career aspirations.

Our career advisor is also available to assist with career planning and appropriate subject choices. It is great to see the breadth of curriculum available and the range of subjects that students can access.

I have been fortunate enough to have meetings with many of our Year 11 Students. These meetings have been in small groups so each student's voice is heard. We discuss their Year 11 experience and future goals. It is insightful to hear the student's perspective and learn what they enjoy and want from their school. I have reminded students in these sessions that many of our students in Year 12 apply for early entry into university and as part of the application process Year 11 results are considered. This means that many of our students in the 2020 HSC cohort already knew they were accepted into university before they sat their final exams. There is information about this process on our Careers website.

Can you believe next term is the last term for our Year 12's? If you are a parent of our current Year 12 cohort, you should be very proud. They continue to make the most of their opportunities and show great dedication to their final few months of school. I have visited a number of Year 12 classrooms recently and have been impressed with their engagement and work ethic. Term 3 can be a very busy and stressful term for these students. Organisation and time management is the key. It is important to have a

study timetable established that considers other commitments. A student's greatest asset is their teacher and they should continue to seek feedback and advice leading up to the Trial examinations and the Higher School Certificate.

The school leadership process for 2022 school leaders has already commenced. Prefect applications and student and staff voting has occurred and I am thrilled to announce the 2022 student leadership team. The team is already meeting and collaborating with each other and the very capable Year 12 student leadership team.



I am proud of the opportunities that are provided to us and the constant support from teachers.


What will you be doing in the holidays?


What will you be doing in the holidavs?

- Ian Wood, Nick Zammit and Ben David all had new additions to their families




















CHANGES FOR TERM 3

Learning management problems are not something we think much about as parents. But we should! Good learning experiences don't just magically happen!

FROM THE P&C

PROBLEMS INTO OPPORTUNITIES

My biggest surprise on first joining the P&C was the discovery of how much of what we as parents believe the Department of Education pays for, and what it does not pay for. Like smaller class sizes; student welfare programs; school counselors; or arts and drama programs. The things that not only improve the learning experience of our kids but their mental health and opportunities to discover interests that may better lead to life-long passions or future careers. Things a lot less possible with ordinary Department of Education funding.

The P&C made a decision this term to help the school with additional funding to enhance some of the opportunities for our kids.

The Department has mandated new literacy and numeracy programs to lift the level of literacy and numeracy across all schools— which is great. It's providing a strategy created by experts for the school to implement. To help execute this strategy to its fullest potential and provide additional resources to assist those teachers involved, the P&C is donating a significant sum of money.

I admit these learning management problems are not something we think much about as parents.

But we should because good learning experiences don't just magically happen, and these difficult decisions our school needs to make all the time, impact the learning and welfare of our kids. To be honest, our school could just implement these programs without all of this extra cost and effort. But the program wouldn't be as effective. The school executive wanted them to be effective for our kids. So, the P&C recently voted unanimously to contribute \$10,560 to support the learning management behind this program – that supports our teachers in making it a success.

We have also been partnering with the school recently in things as varied as repairing the school's piano to funding shortfalls in Edrolo payments. The P&C has also become a tax-deductible charity, so you can even claim your P&C contribution as a tax deduction.

The P&C will endeavor to keep you informed of the things you might not know about, that create a better learning environment for our kids.
