
I would also like to congratulate the other award winners honoured at our various graduation and presentation events who excelled in 2021. During the week we also congratulated and awarded our students who had excellent attendance records. The Department of Education has a benchmark of above 90% attendance for all students. This is also the benchmark that we will continue to endorse in 2022. Students will be recognised for excellent attendance and those under the 90% benchmark without special circumstances will not be able to attend extra-curricular activities. At Narrabeen Sports High School we have been focusing on the importance of attendance and the direct correlation between academic achievement and attending school.

I don't want to dwell on what a 'unprecedented' year this has been, it has passed and we can now look forward, instead I'd like to highlight some of the big wins we have had as a school in 2021. These include:

- Collaboration with Manly United Football Club which will enable our Academy Students coaching and a pathway to representative opportunities
- Our new canteen provider has commenced and proven to be both an economical and tasty success
- The success of the NARRA Challenge our Student Leadership Team initiated during lockdown. This gained acknowledgement from the NSW Department of Education, prompting other schools to do their own version (which wasn't as successful as ours!!!)
- The excellent Creative Arts events in Term 2 showcasing the talents of a variety of students both at Narrabeen Sports High School and the local primary schools
- Of the sporting events that were held, as a school we did exceptionally well across a variety of sports from Dance to Baseball and everything in between. We were the overall Champion School (of over 50 schools) at both the Zone Swimming and Zone Athletics carnivals. I know if the representative sport season was able to progress further that our school would have been at the forefront.

There are many other areas of the school that are mentioned in this or previous versions of Around the Grounds. Most of these achievements are reliant on staff and their willingness to go above and beyond in support of our young people. I am so grateful to the staff of Narrabeen Sports High School. I know that despite the year that has been, we have achieved and progressed as a group in many, many areas.




