





We have been training in a specialised indoor skate park called CA-TF (California Training Facility) owned by California skateparks who build skate parks for the Olympics, X games and Vans park series. The CA-TF is a huge park as well as a large street section complete with gym and treatment area. The skate park is not open to the public, only through National organisations like Skate Australia or through a major sponsor like Nike SB or Vans.

Most days I wake up at 6am and I try to surf until 9am then breakfast. 11am-2pm at the TF. Lunch and then off to another skate park 4-6pm, dinner at 7ish in bed by 9pm. Pretty much every day.

It's hard finding girls to train with in Australia as female skateboarding has only been popular for a few years now. So when I'm in the US I can get to train with Olympians like Skyand Sakura who are gold and bronze Olympic medallist. I love to skate with these girls as they're the best in the world and I can see the level I need to be to reach the top. All of us encourage one another even though we compete against each other. Skateboarding has a culture of supporting each other when we land our tricks.

Its always hard being away from home. I miss my Mum and my sisters, Narrabeen and my school friends.





## **SPOTLIGHT**

#### **NEWS FROM OUR TAS FACULTY**

2022 is already a busy year in TAS. We farewelled Mr Neale Asby at the end of 2021. We congratulate Ms Catherine Arnott's permanent appointment to our department and we also wish Ms Amy Chong well on her maternity leave and say hello to Ms Dianne Leeson, Mr Peter Whittaker and Mr Shannon Higgins.

**Stage 6:** Year 12 Industrial Technology Timber and Design and Technology classes are busy working on their Major Projects and related portfolios that are due in Term 3. Year 11 Design and Technology have completed their first project designing lamps and we saw some creative designs, they are now working on their next design task, children's toys. Year 12 Food Tech have been developing line extensions or me-too products for the Food Product Development unit and Yr 11 have been studying Food Quality, how and why food behaves the way it does. Year 12 VET Hospitality and Construction classes have completed their workplacements with various local businesses and Year 11 VET Hospitality are completing workplacement in term 3.

Stage 5: Year 10 Industrial Technology Timber classes have just completed a tool carry-all and related portfolio with a special mention by Baxter H and Jesse R. Year 9 completed a pot stand and planter box with special mention to Mya, Flyn, Byron, Cam, Rex and Harrison for their great practical work. Year 10 Food Technology completed their first unit, Nutrition for Life unit and are now studying Food Equity. Year 9 Food Technology are studying Australian food habits, investigating bush foods and working towards researching other cultures and their influence on Australian cuisine. Textiles and Design have just completed an apparel unit where they made shorts or skirts and are now showing their creativity in textiles arts. Information Software Development completed game design development and are now developing their video editing skills. Design and Technology have shown their creativity by using the 3D printer, timber, fabric and even clay to produce their storage solutions. Our school cafe is up and running as our year 10 VET Hospitality students are developing their coffee making, cafe and customer service skills and attended a day at a coffee school. Year 9 Industrial Technology Multimedia is a new elective course this year and they have been designing and creating brands through marketing and website development

**Stage 4:** Yr 7 and 8 Technology Mandatory are busy working on their second unit, either Food and Agriculture, Mixed Materials or Engineered Systems. Food and Agriculture students have prepared foods based on the Australian Dairy industry, which concluded with students designing and preparing their individual shake or smoothie. Students in Mixed Materials used the sewing machines and fabric decoration techniques to design and make a tote bag or cushion cover and Engineered systems students designed and made CO2 powered speed racer cars or timber cam toys. Digital Technology is developing the year 8 students' coding skills.

Ms Arnott and Mr Page took a combined group of yr 10, 9 and 8 IST, Multi Media, and Technology Mandatory Digital HPGE students to a drone day where students programmed and flew drones through a series of challenges. The students came back inspired and we look forward seeing their drone flying skills later in the year.

Is it really only the end of term 2? The TAS staff look forward to more creative activities and solutions by our students in the remainder of the year.

As the HSC draws near our Senior students are encouraged to accept the support systems that are available to them. 'Band Aid' club is available at breakfast, during Raise the Roof and lunchtime.

We also have an extensive study skills program for Years 11 and 12, delivered by teachers and external providers. Key ideas include how to read a syllabus, how to make effective summary notes, how to organise your time (Study planner or Google Calendar) and tips for revision. Our Teacher-Librarian supports students in their private study time with proof-reading and essay structuring.

Fostering positive wellbeing and how it can become a powerful force in students' learning and development underpinned everything we do at Narrabeen Sports High School. Some of the additional support include:

- Teacher mentor for each Year 12 individual student
- Year Advisers Miss Lynch and Mr Moore
- Fortnightly year assemblies with guest speakers and help strategies
- Student Support Officer (Ellen)
- School Counsellors
- Wellbeing programs such as Tomorrow Man and Tomorrow Woman and Paul Dillon (Director and founder of DARTA (Drug and Alcohol Research and Training Australia})
